To participate an applicant is required:

- Be aged between 15 to 18 years old
- To pay the annual fee of \$300 (if successful in being selected)
- Not already hold an aviation licence
- Be in good health (able to pass a NZTA drivers medical)

(exception to these requirements may be allowed at the discretion of Wanganui Aero Club on receipt of application)

Young Eagles Membership costs an annual fee of \$300 and includes:

- Wanganui Aero Club Junior Membership
- 3x 1/2 hour flying lessons with a qualified Wanganui Aero Club Instructor
- Wanganui Aero Club Young Eagles T-Shirt
- Discounted aviation study books

Wanganui Aero Club Young Eagles Terms and Conditions

Young Eagles are considered Junior Aero Club members and are gifted a full flying membership to the club whilst under the age of 18 and in secondary school however they will not have voting rights at the Annual General Meeting. Young Eagles are expected to fully participate in all meetings and activities throughout the 12 month program. If unable to attend a meeting the Young Eagle must contact the CFI or Young Eagles Coordinator to advise so. Failure to attend two meetings without contact will result in removal from the program without further notice.

Young Eagles represent the club when at the club or on visits, and therefore must behave in a polite and respectful manner. Young Eagles may at times travel in private vehicles to industry visits. On occasion, when flying trips are preplanned with approved club pilots, Young Eagles may be asked to help contribute to the cost of the flight. Young Eagles may fly in privately owned aircraft including certificated and limited category aircraft including but not limited to, microlights and warbirds. By signing this the parent gives permission for the Chief Flying Instructor or Young Eagles Coordinator to allow the Young Eagle to participate in these flights. Young Eagles must ask permission before flying in an aircraft if offered a ride by another pilot or club member. Young Eagles programme includes flights with both qualified flight instructors and licenced private pilots. Time flown in aircraft flown by licenced pilots that are not qualified flight instructors cannot be counted toward flight training. The use of a cell phone and the taking of photos and/or videos while on a Young Eagles flight must be approved by the Pilot in Command of that flight. Photos and videos must not be published on social media without the express permission of the Young Eagles Flight Leader.

The CFI (Chief Flying Instructor) recognises the duty of care given to the club and its members/pilots, and only allows our best pilots/role models to fly with the Young Eagles. The CFI also knows aircraft and will only allow a Young Eagle to fly in an aircraft if he is familiar with the aircraft, its owner and maintenance providers.

Parents are encouraged to get involved as well and are welcome to attend visits, events, and fundraisers.

The participant and I understand that flying in aircraft and being around aircraft involve risks. Serious injury and or death can result from many causes including but not limited to airplane crashes. Wanganui Aero Club works to mitigate these risks to the greatest practicable extent, any concerns should be brought to the attention of the Chief Flying Instructor at the earliest possible occasion.
